AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ORDINANCE REGULATING THE WEIGHT LIMITS ON VEHICLES ON TOWN OF SUGAR CREEK ROADS

Section I - Statement of Authority.

The Town Board of the Town of Sugar Creek, Walworth County, Wisconsin, has the specific authority under Wis. Stats. §§66.0114(1)-(3), 345.20-345.53, 349.03, 349.06, 349.16, 348.17, 348.26 & 348.27, to adopt this ordinance. Towns have been authorized and delegated the authority to enact and enforce, in their own discretion, seasonal and special weight limits, and exceptions to those special and seasonal limits, on their own roads, pursuant to Wis. Stat. §349.16. The Board finds the following regulations to be in strict conformity with its authority and direction under Wis. Stat. §349.16, and not contrary to or inconsistent with Wis. Stat. chs. 341 to 348 and 350.

The Town Board, by this Ordinance, adopted on proper notice with a quorum and a majority vote of the Town Board present and voting, provides the authority for the Town to establish special and/or seasonal weight limits, general weight limits, enforcement and penalties, all as set forth herein.

Section Π - Adoption of General Weight Limitations on Town Roads.

For purposes of this Ordinance, all highways maintained by the Town shall be referred to as "Town Roads," except that no portion of any such highway which is a state trunk highway or connecting highway may be designated a Town Road.

The Town Board, by this Ordinance, designates the following Town Roads to be class "B" highways for the purpose of putting into effect the weight limitations set forth in Wis. Stat. §348.16: "As set forth in the State of Wisconsin, Department of Transportation, Wisconsin Information System for Local Roads for the Town of Sugar Creek."

Section III -Adoption of Special and Seasonal Weight Limitations on Specified Town Roads.

(a) Special Weight Limitations.

The Town Board may designate, from time to time and by Resolution of the Town Board, special weight limits on any portion of a Town Road determined by the Board to need additional protection due to road conditions then occurring.

Where a Town Road is in need of immediate additional protection due to weakness of the roadbed, deterioration, climatic conditions or other special or temporary conditions, which are likely to cause serious damage in the absence of such special limitations, as determined in the discretion of the Town Highway Patrolman, Town Chair or Town Supervisor, then said Town Highway Patrolman, Town Chair or Town Supervisor may temporarily designate and post special weight limits on any portion of a Town Road. Such designation shall remain in full force and effect until the next Board Meeting, at which the Town Board shall consider whether to extend or

terminate the special weight limitations. The Town Board's action shall be by Resolution of the Town Board.

The Special Weight Limitations shall apply to Town Roads specified in the "Resolution Designating Special Weight Limitations."

(b) Seasonal Weight Limitations.

Seasonal vehicle weight limits of eight (8) tons maximum [16,000.01 or more pounds] shall be effective during the period set by the Town Highway Patrolman annually to coincide with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation spring thaw determinations for the year in question, and reported to the Town Board at the first scheduled Town Board meeting following the posting. The Town Board may modify the determinations of the Town Highway Patrolman as the Town Board deems necessary. The Town Board's action shall be by Resolution of the Town Board.

The Special Weight Limitations shall apply to Town Roads specified in the "Resolution Designating Special Weight Limitations."

(c) Exemptions to Seasonal Weight Limitations.

The Seasonal Weight Limitations shall NOT apply to the following vehicles, which shall be exempt from all Seasonal Weight Limitations:

- (1) Septic Haulers complying with Wis. Stat. §349.16(3), which are traveling to destinations where they will be emptying holding tanks which are full or otherwise endanger public health and safety. This exception does not apply if pumping of a tank can safely be deferred until after the expiration of this seasonal limit;
- (2) Empty Vehicle Or Vehicle Combinations being moved directly to or from a storage or maintenance facility located on a posted town road;
- (3) Farm Tractor Hauling a Single Or Tandem Axle Manure Trailer operated under and complying with a permit allowing a weight limit excluding the tractor, of 15,000 pounds per axle for up to two axles, for operations from a farm for spreading; and,
- (4) Milk Haulers which are picking up and transporting milk from dairy farms. Milk haulers shall use the shortest lawful direct route over town roads to and from dairies, and shall have the vehicle tag axle fully deployed, or this exemption does not apply.

(d) Exemptions to both Special and Season Weight Limitations.

Town vehicles engaged in official duties, public safety vehicles, fuel trucks, school buses and garbage and recycling trucks contracted by the Town, shall be exempt from the seasonal and special weight restrictions of this Ordinance.

(e) Delivery of Heavy Loads Not Exempt; Permit Required.

Unless otherwise exempt, delivery of heavy loads to their ultimate destination shall be delayed until after the expiration of the season weight limits.

Section IV - Signage and Maps.

Appropriate weight limitation signs shall be erected on Town Roads as required by Wis. Stat. §349.16(2).

Weight limit signage may include notice of the general weight limitations established as well as special or seasonal weight limitations. For example, the Town Highway Patrolman (or designee) may identify roads frequently used in violation of the ordinance and erect proper signage to warn drivers of the ordinance requirements such as "NO THROUGH TRUCKS OVER XX TONS PER TOWN ORDINANCE," or "WEIGHT LIMITS ENFORCED FOR VEHICLES EXCEEDING XX TONS." Flags or other markings may be used to draw attention to signage, particularly for seasonal signage.

All such signage existing as of the date of adoption of this Ordinance shall be considered approved by the Town Board. Periodically hereafter, the Town Highway Patrolman and Town Board shall review the use and location of such signage, and may recommend or approve changes to existing signage and/or addition of new signage by Resolution of the Board. The Town Clerk, in consultation with the Town Highway Patrolman, shall maintain a map showing the approximate location of the signs, which map shall be available for reference purposes at the Town Hall and/or the Office of the Town Clerk.

Section V - Enforcement and Penalties.

No person may operate any vehicle on the above-noted highways, in violation of a posted seasonal or special weight limit, as described in this Ordinance.

The forfeiture for a first violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars. The forfeiture for a second or subsequent offense shall be One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the total forfeiture shall not exceed the total forfeiture for equally overweight vehicle, with the same history of convictions, as calculated under the formulas included in Wis. Stat. §348.21.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 345.47, the Town shall recover as costs of the action under Wis. Stats. §§814.01 and 814.036, its actual reasonable expert witness and attorneys fees.

The vehicle need not be physically weighed, nor must the precise weight of the vehicle be shown, to prove a violation of this Ordinance, provided there is clear and convincing circumstantial evidence a violation existed. The manufacturer's published empty weight of a vehicle shall be presumed to be the empty weight of a vehicle, in the absence of evidence to the contrary.

If any section, clause, provision or portion of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall not be affected and the charge may be amended to a violation of Wis. Chapter 348.

The Ordinance shall be enforced in accordance with provisions of Wis. Stat. §§ 345.20 to 345.53, Chapter 800, and §66.12, which are hereby adopted by reference and made a part of this Ordinance.
